## Notes On School Curricula

The Maryland Youth Tobacco Survey (MYTS) was administered in the fall of 2000 and 2002. When surveyed early in the school year, students couldn't provide information about tobacco use prevention curricula that would be taught later in the school years. Instead, students were asked to recall what they had been taught during the previous school year.

The responses from the fall 2000 survey are the baseline level of activity prior to implementation of the CRF: Tobacco Program. The first full year of funding for the Tobacco Program was the 2001-2002 school year. The fall 2002 MYTS data represents the first year of program implementation for the school-based element of the program.

In both 2000 and 2002, students were asked each of the following two questions:

1. "During this PAST school year [specified], were you taught in any of your classes about tobacco use?" The results for this question appear in the columns entitled "Taught About Tobacco Use."
2. "During this PAST school year [specified], did you practice ways to say NO to tobacco in any of your classes (for example, by role playing)?" The results of this question appear in the columns entitled "Used Role Play."

In the 2002 survey, four additional questions were asked:

1. "During this PAST school year [specified], were you taught in any of your classes the reasons why people your age smoke?" The results of this question appear in the columns entitled "Taught Why Youth Smoke."
2. "During this PAST school year [specified], were you taught in any of your classes that most people your age do not smoke cigarettes?" The results of this question appear in the columns entitled "Taught Few Youth Smoke."
3. "During this PAST school year [specified], were you taught in any of your classes about the effects of smoking, like it makes your teeth yellow, causes wrinkles, or makes you smell bad?" The results of this question appear in the columns entitled "Taught Effects of Smoking."
4. "During this PAST school year [specified], did what you learned in school help you feel it is okay to say "No" to friends who offer you cigarettes?" The results of this question appear in the columns entitled "What Taught Will Help."

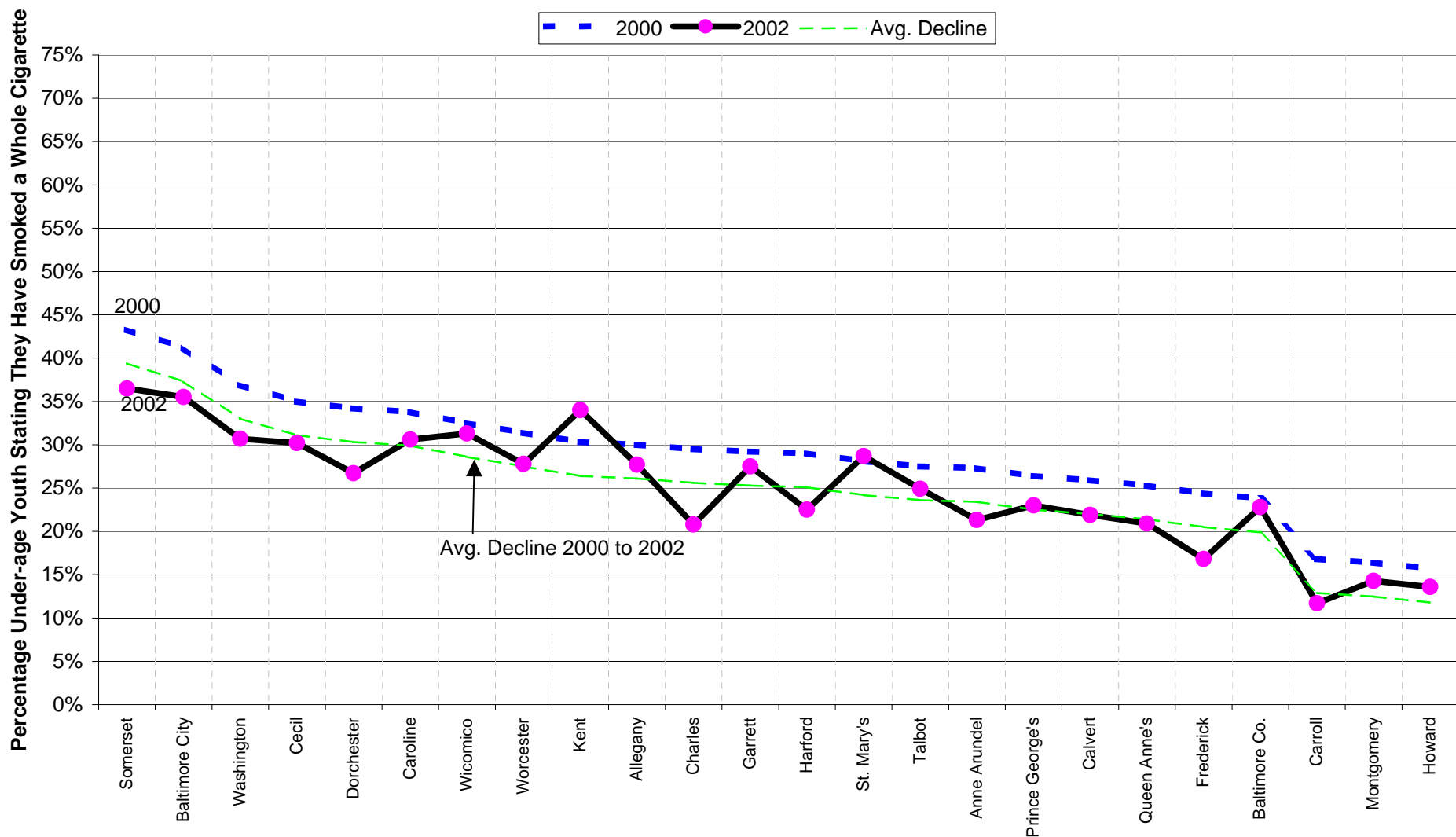

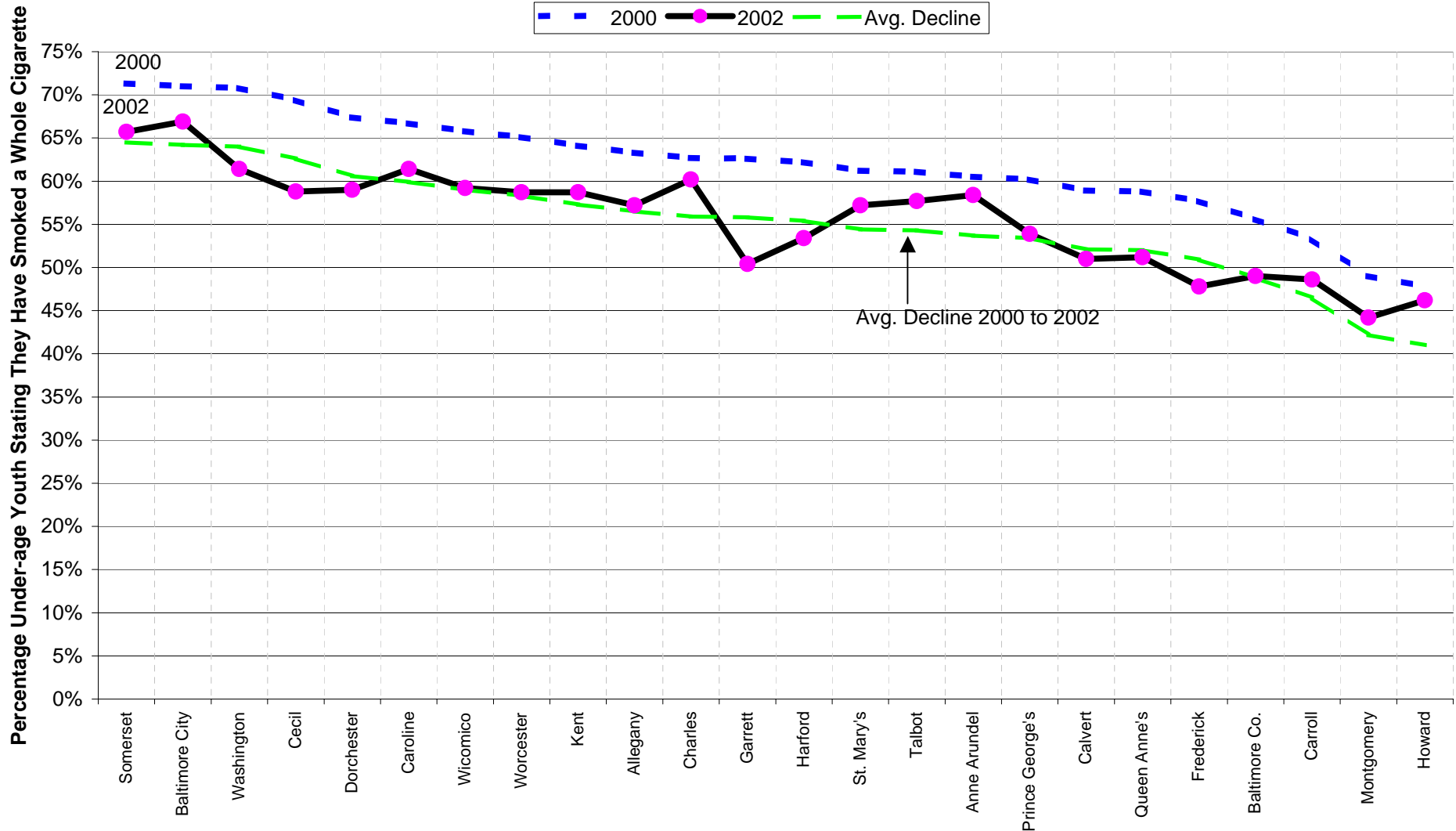

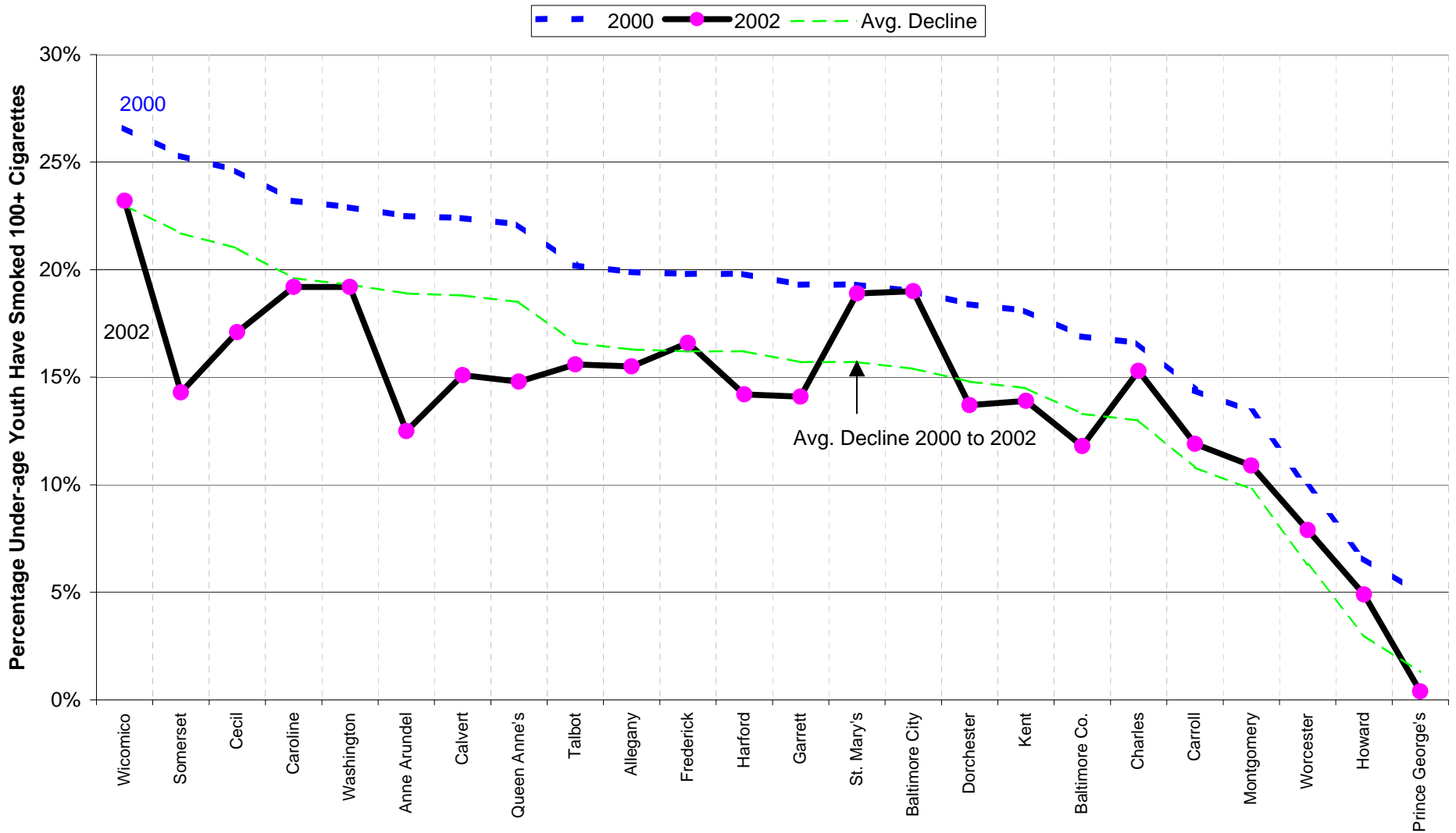
## EVER SMOKED A WHOLE CIGARETTE - MIDDLE SCHOOL



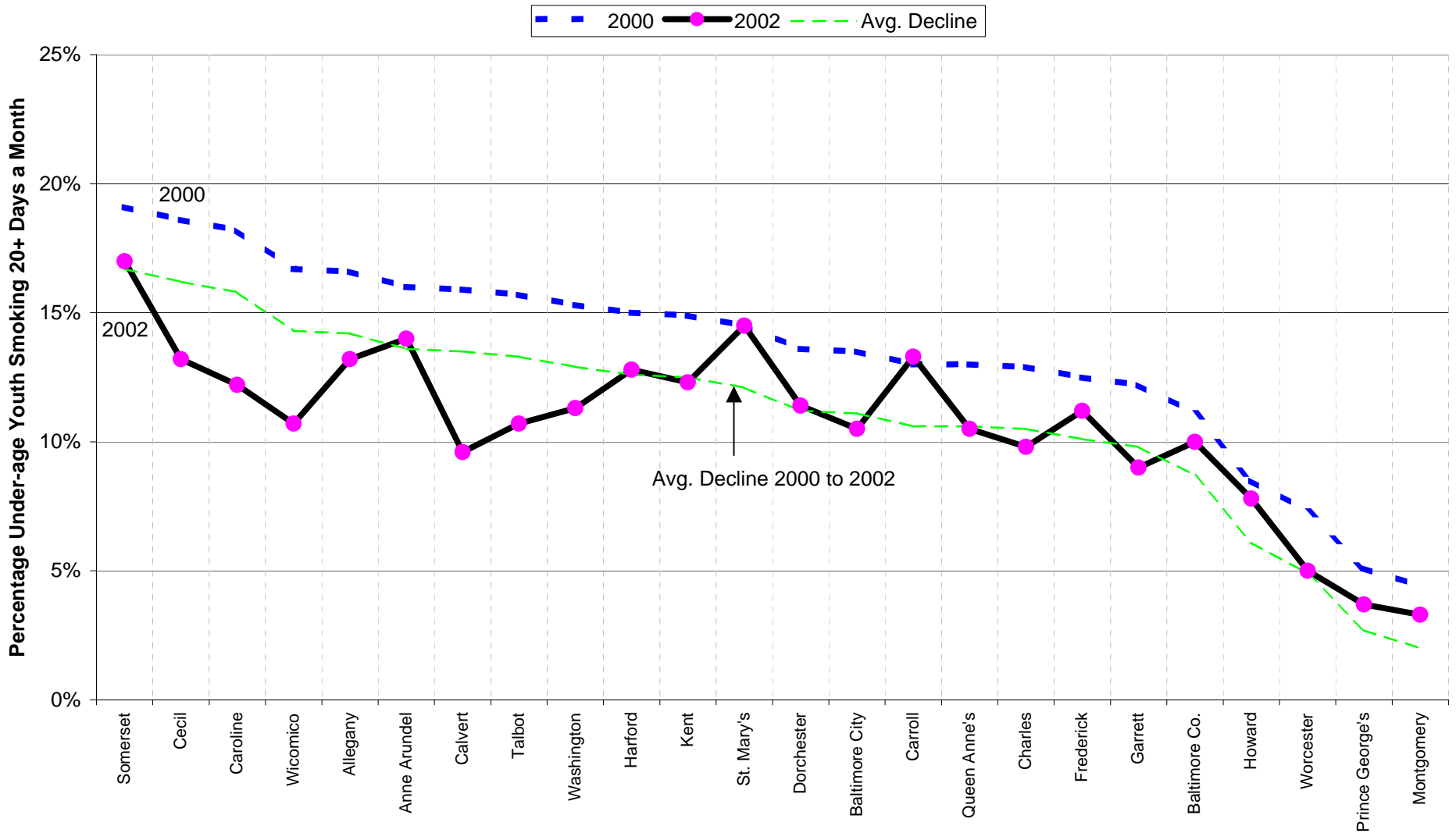

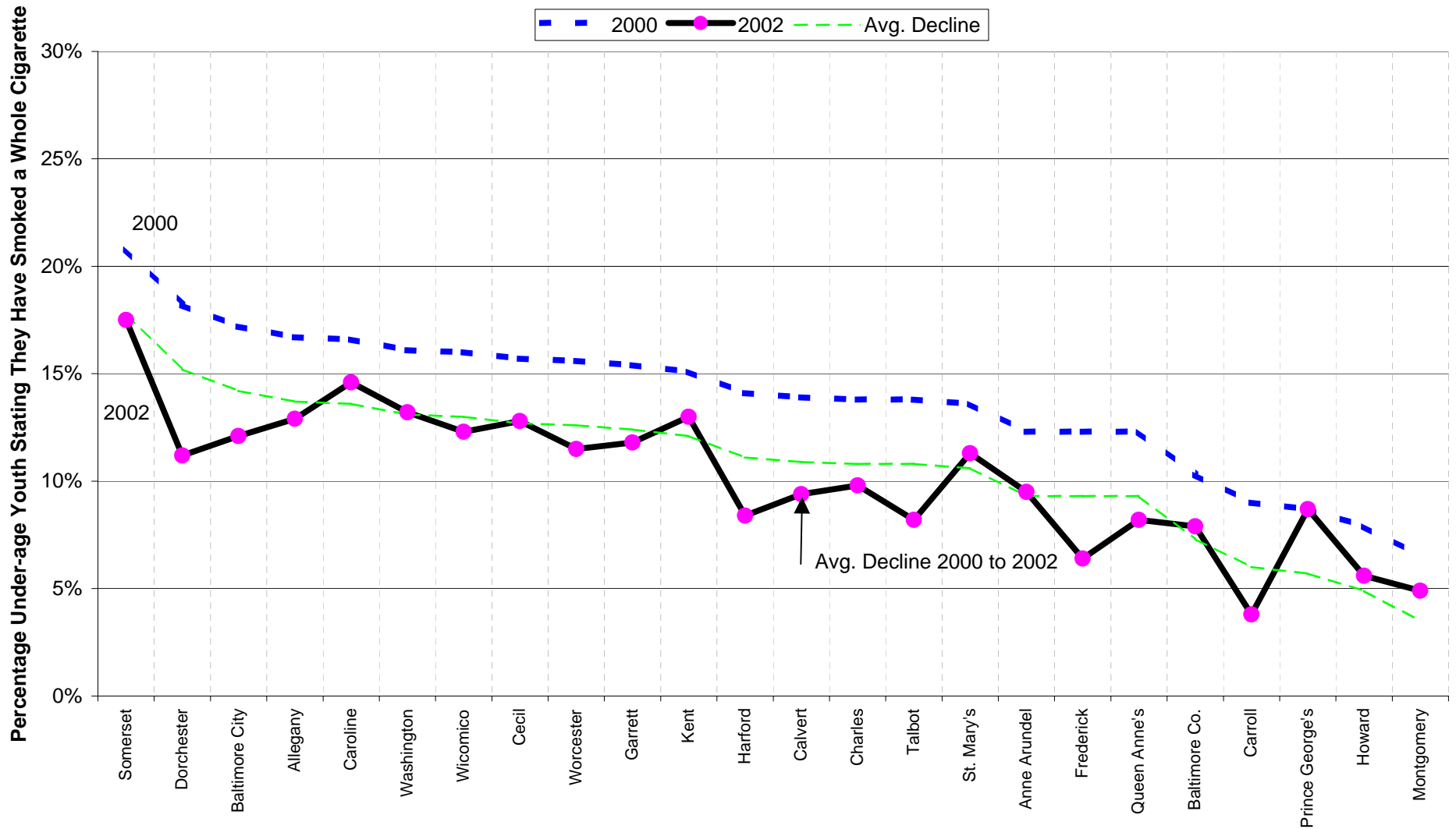

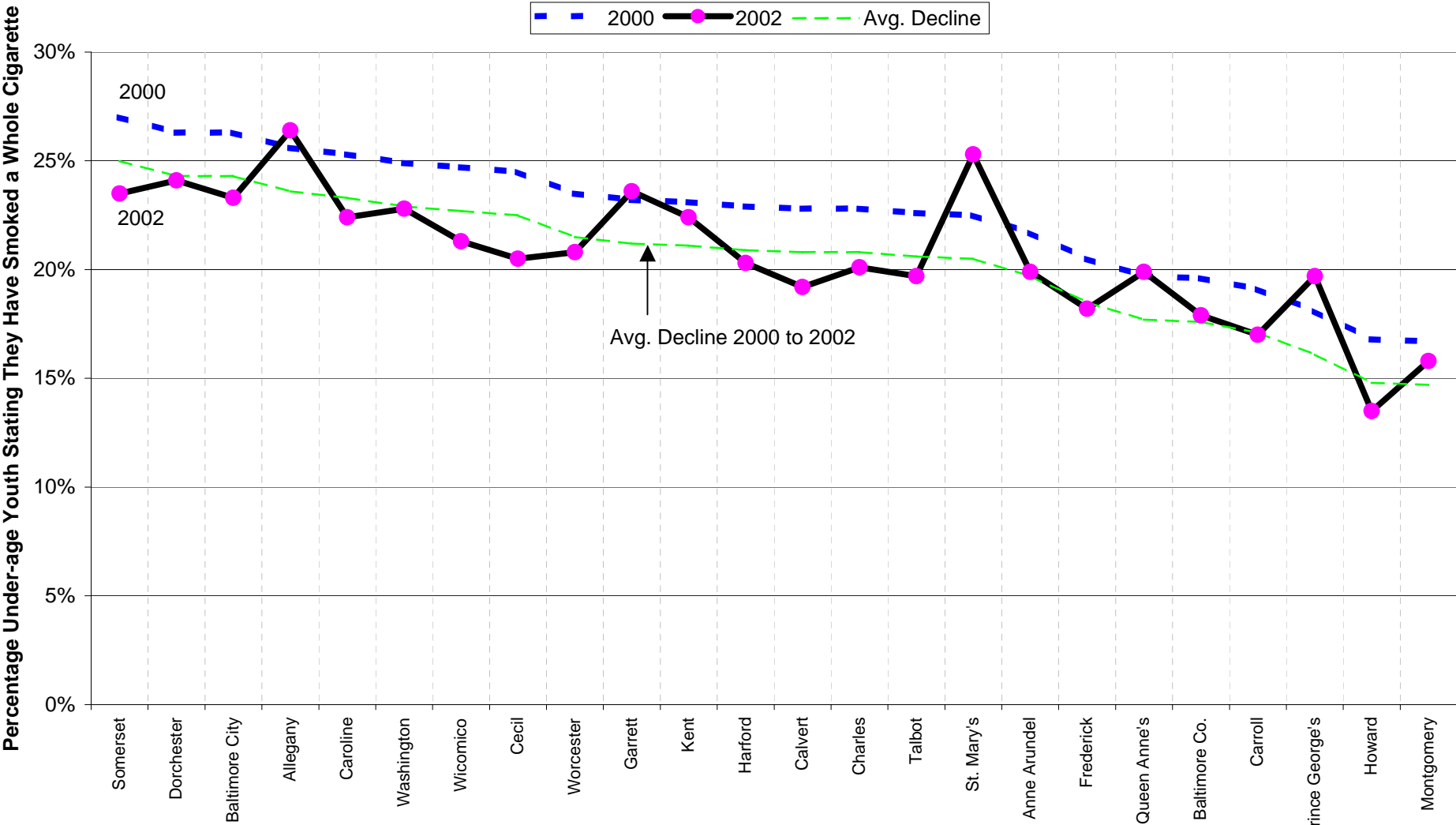
# FREQUENT CIGARETTE SMOKERS - HIGH SCHOOL



# INITIATED CIGARETTE SMOKING IN PAST 2 YEARS - MIDDLE SCHOOL

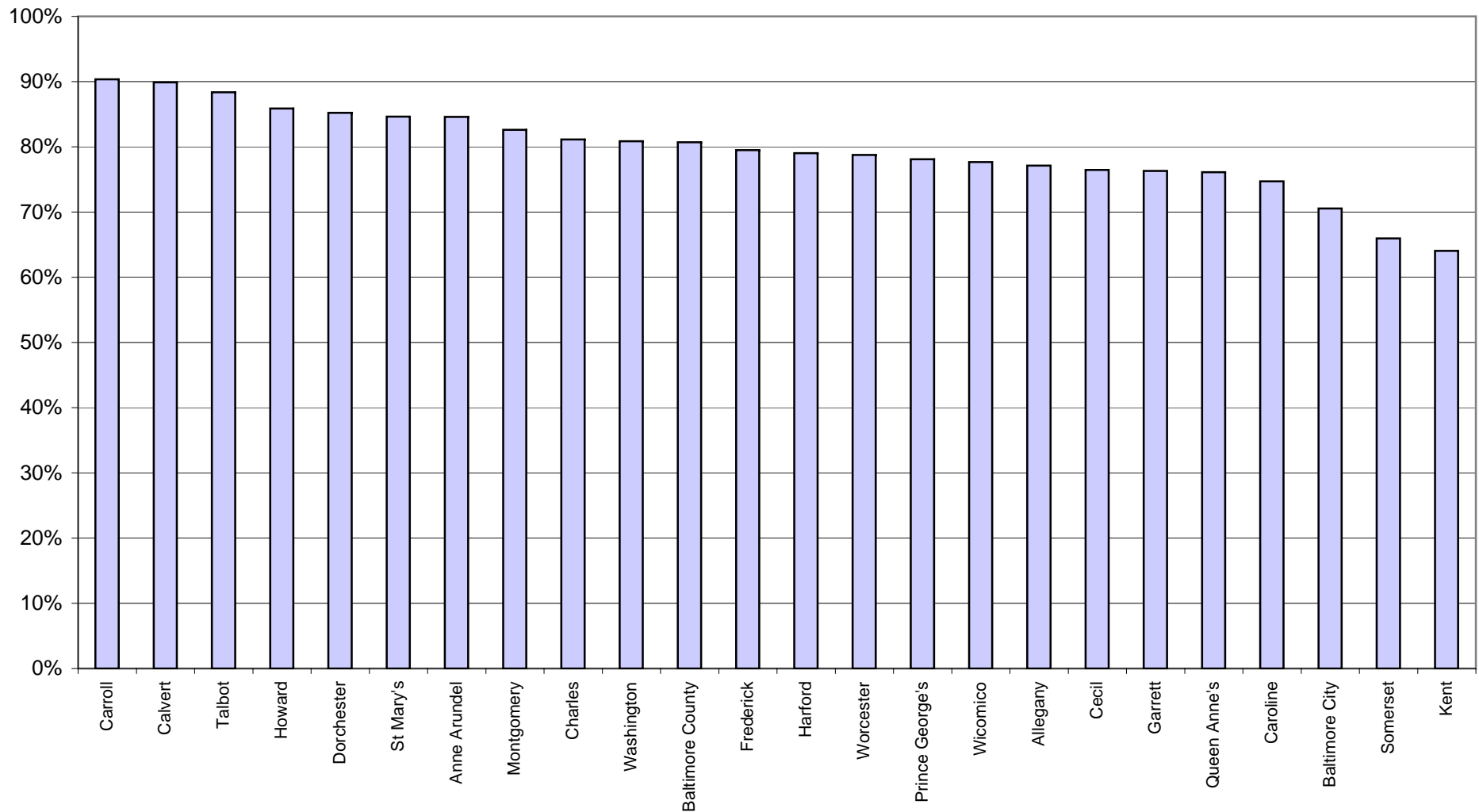

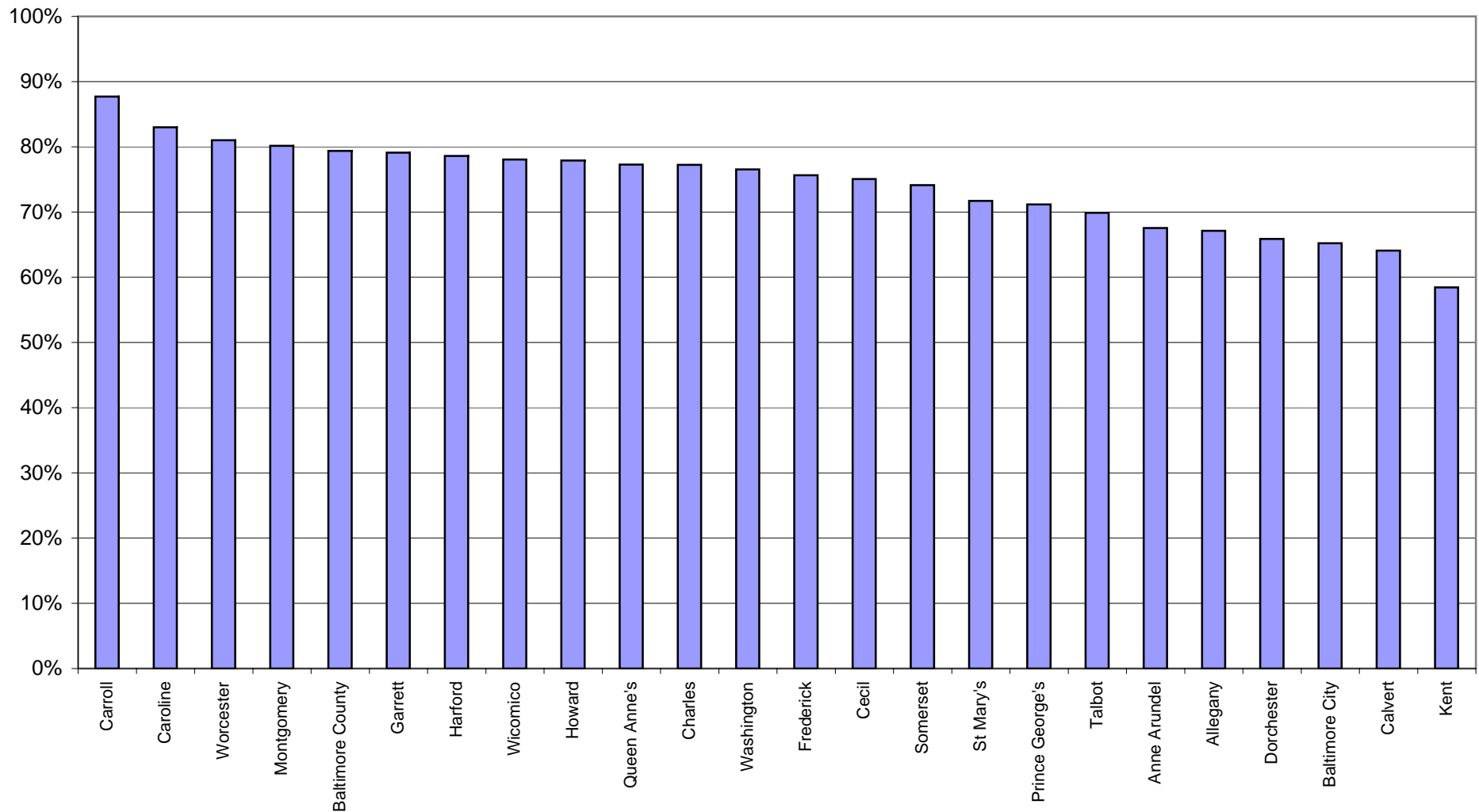

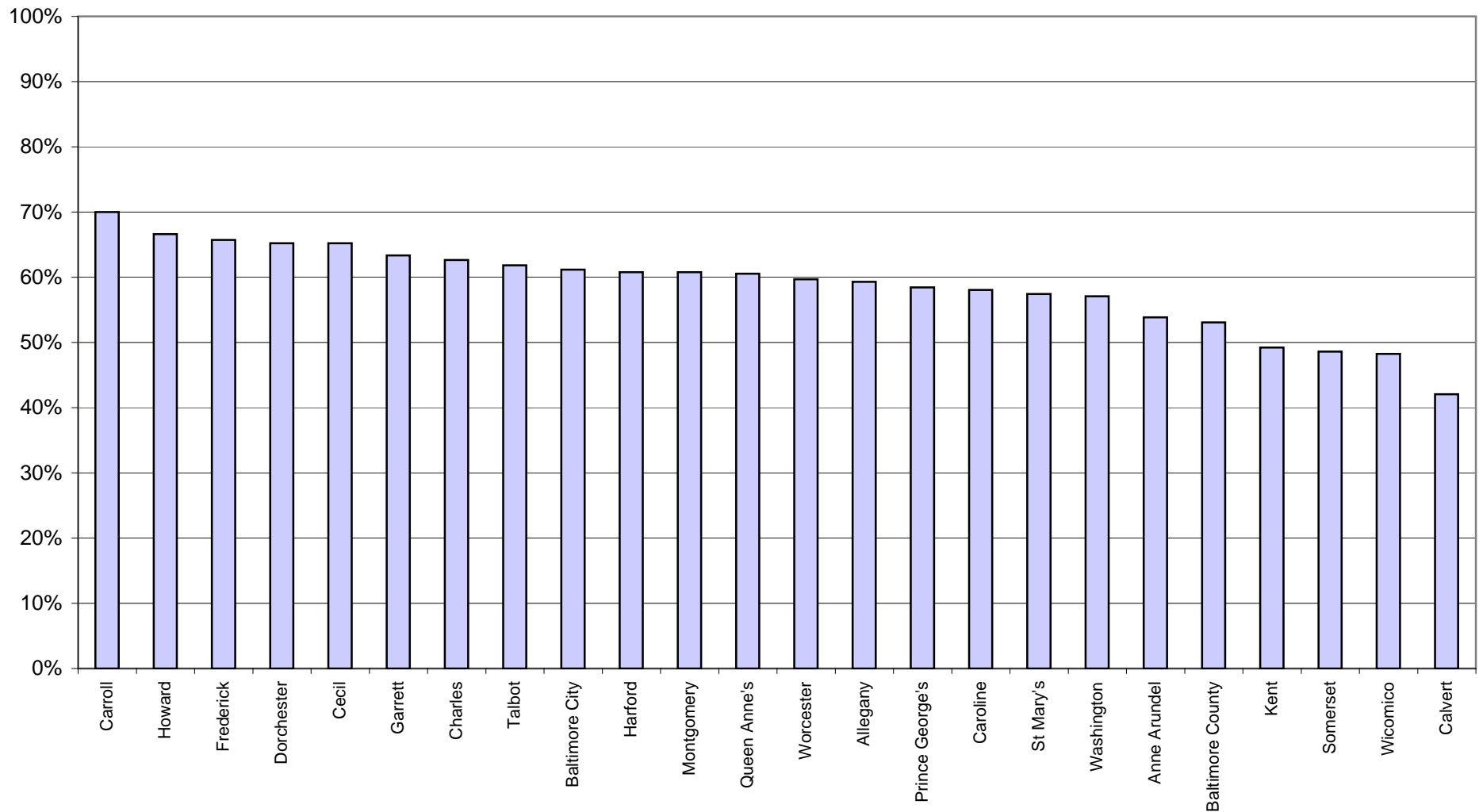

Statements by 8th Grade Youth Recalling What They Were Taught the Previous School Year (2001-2002)



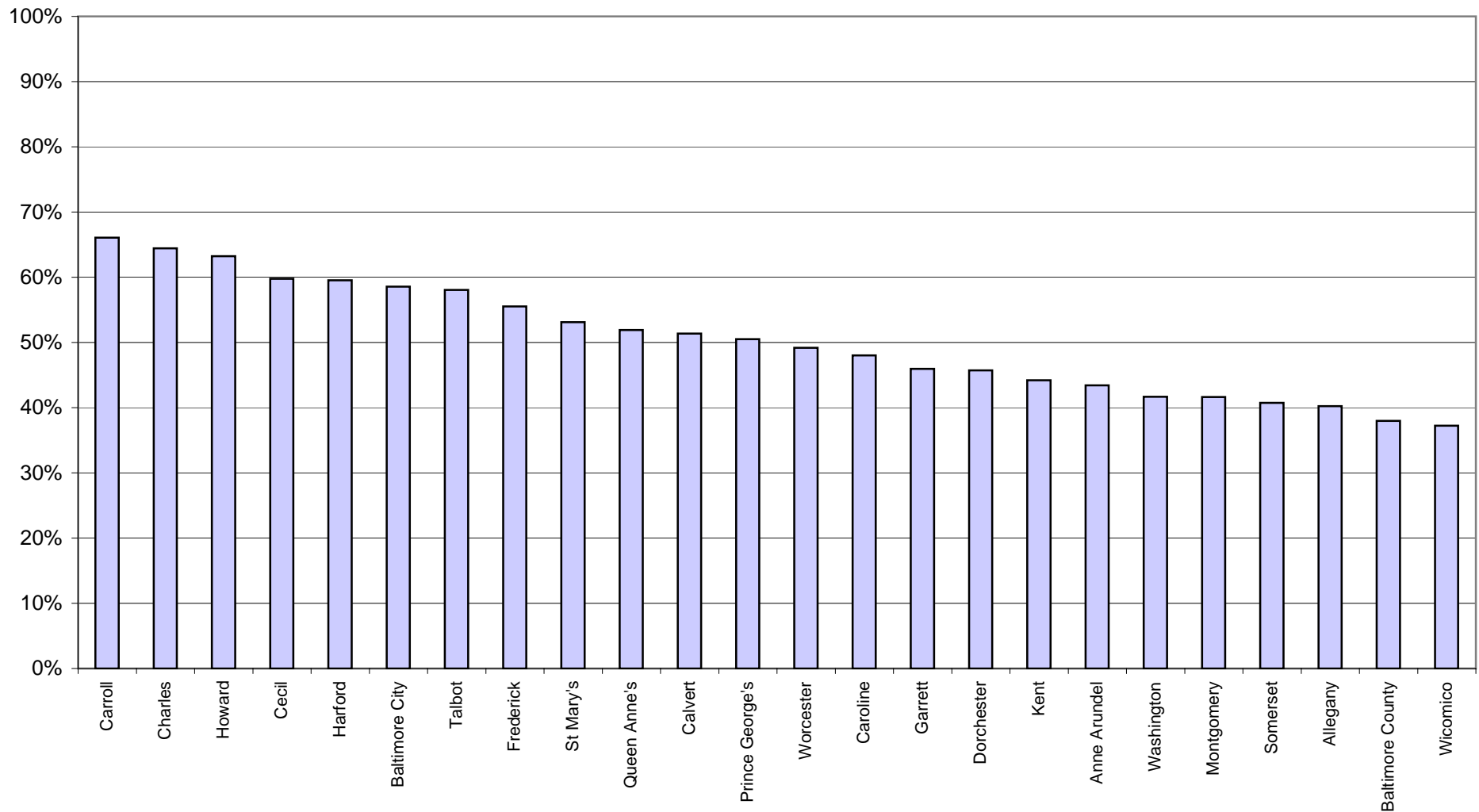

Statements by 9th Grade Youth Recalling What They Were Taught the Previous School Year (2001-2002)



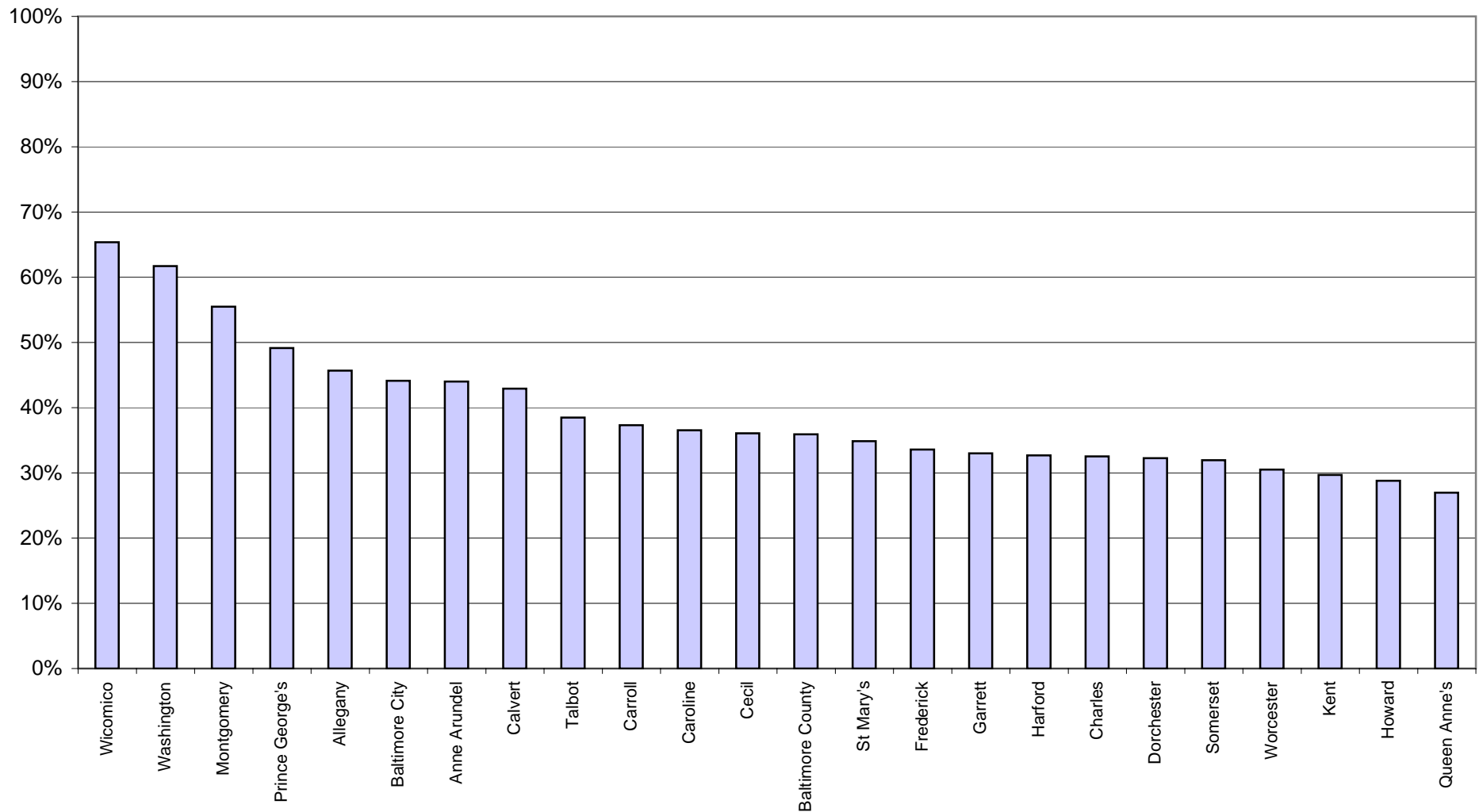

Statements by 10th Grade Youth Recalling What They Were Taught The Previous School Year (2001-2002)



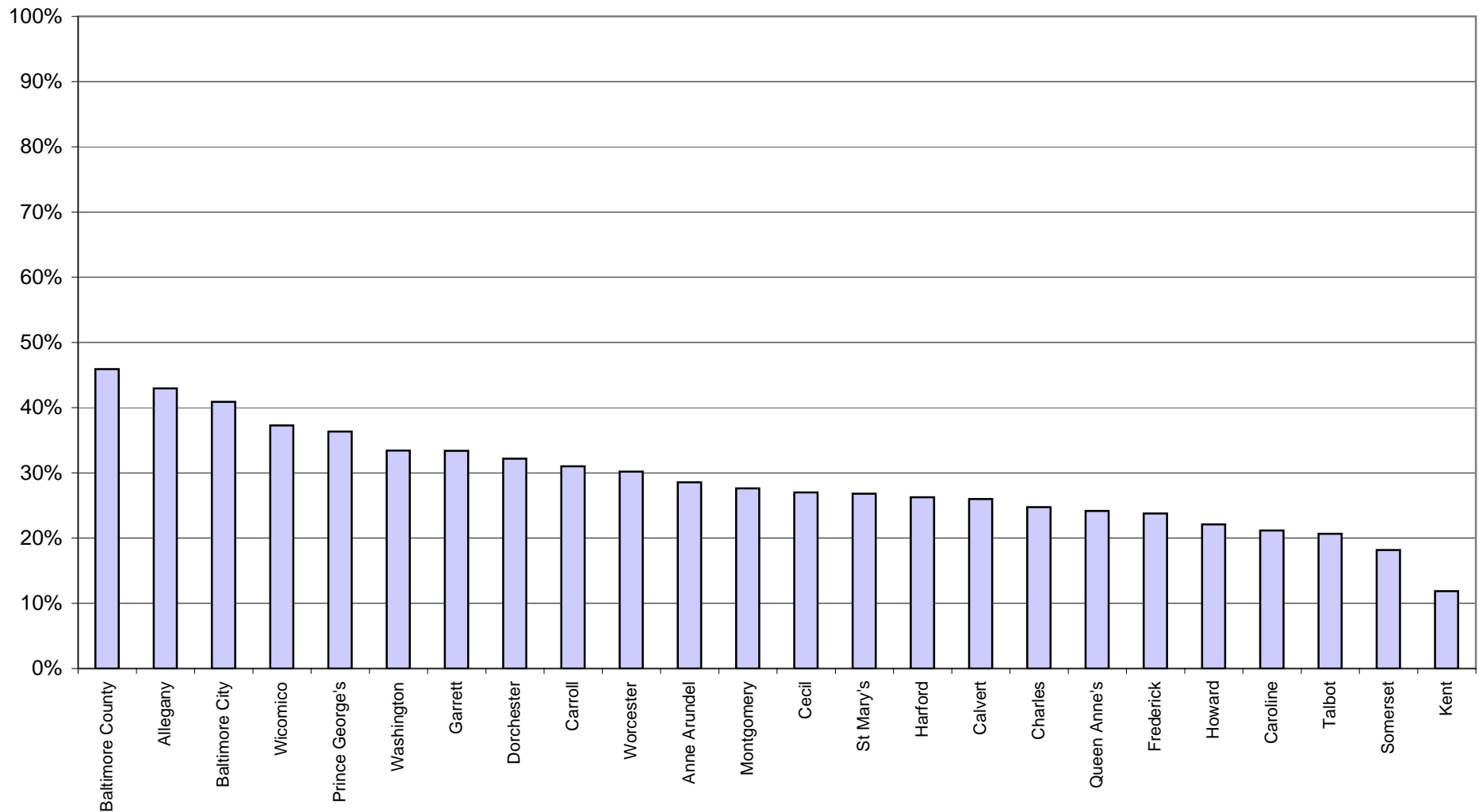

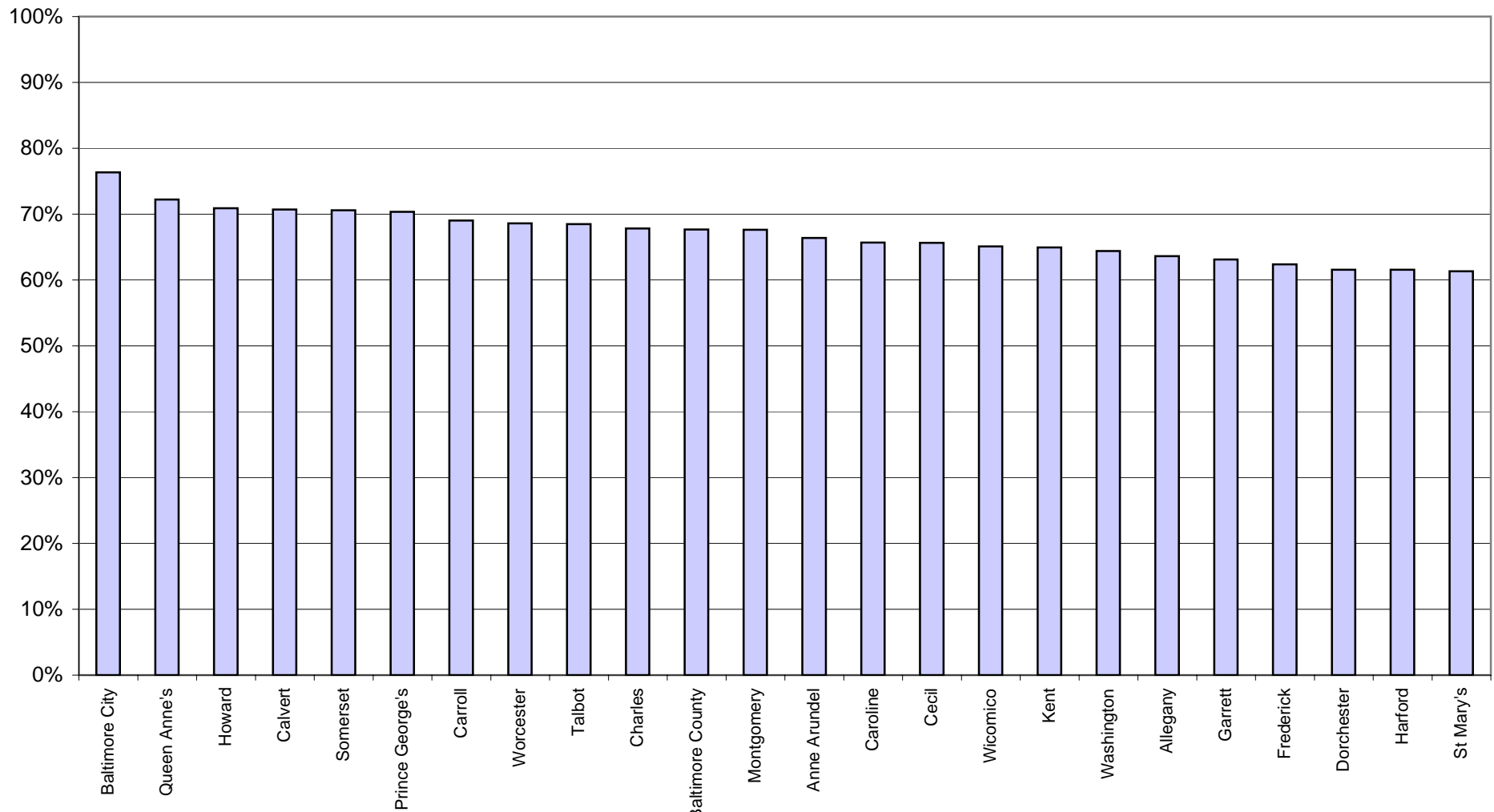

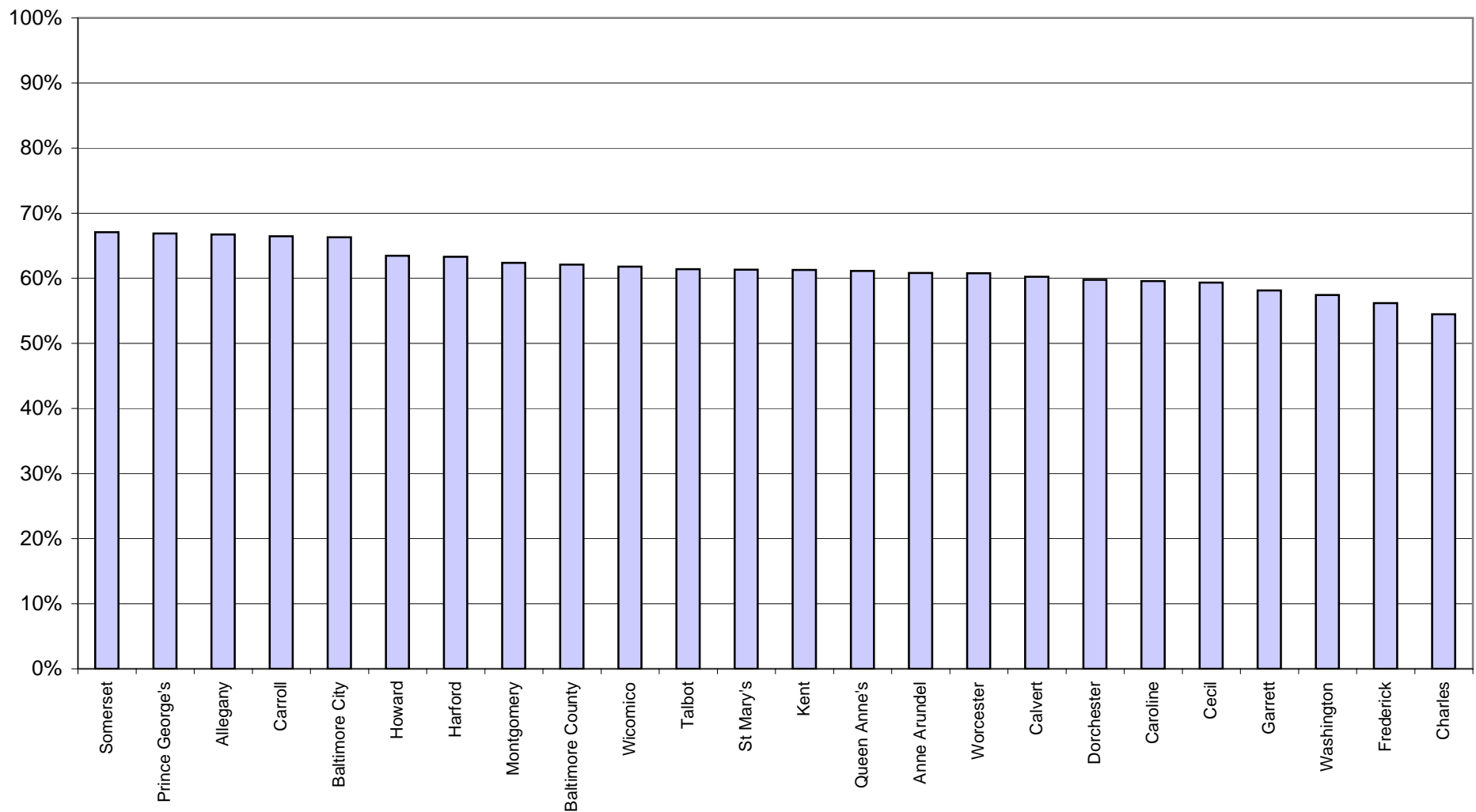

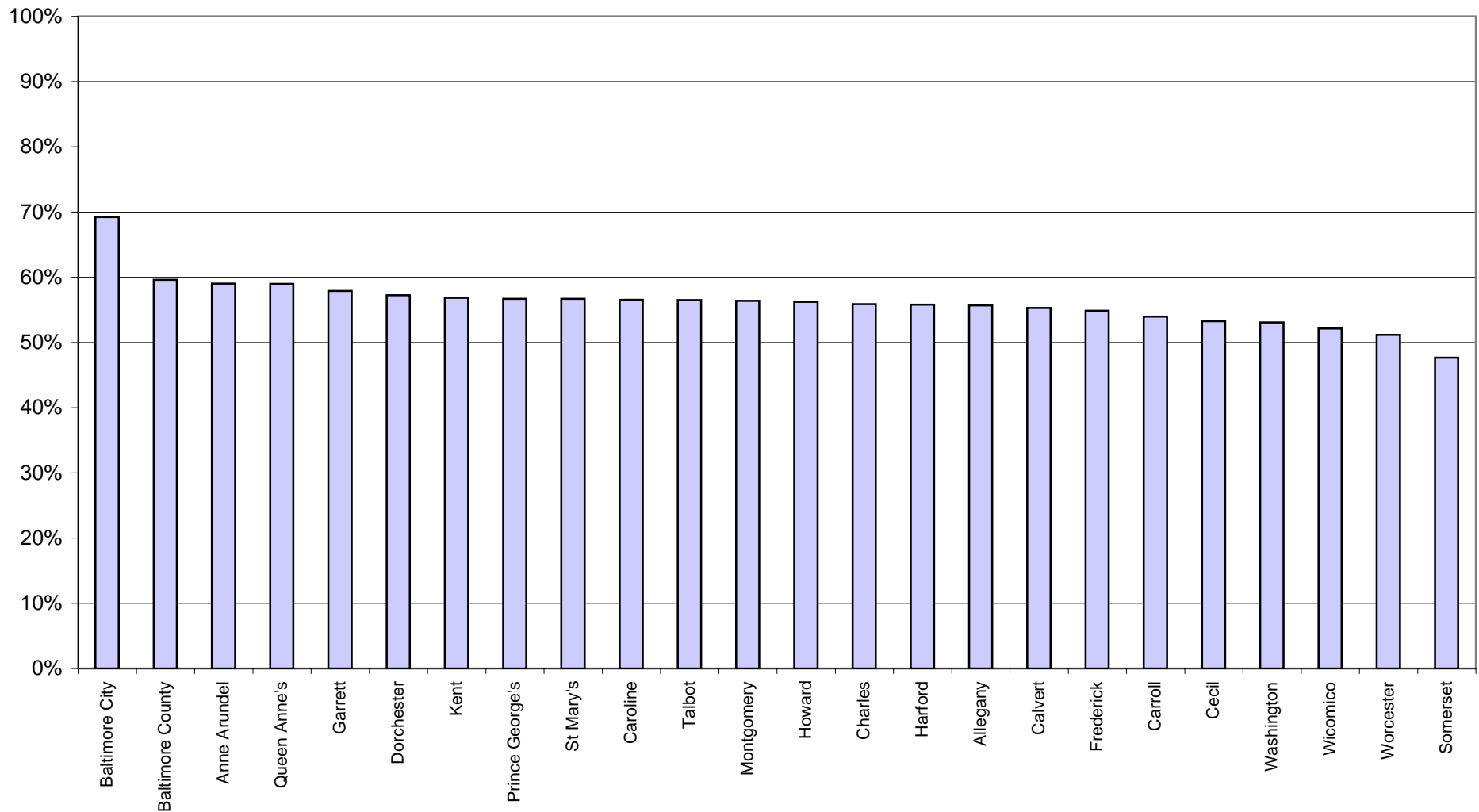
